

## What Do Our Affiliation Fees To England Golf And County Organisations Pay For?

The above question is a frequent one from golf club members new to golf. In simple terms the answer is the administration of golf at a national and regional level where club representatives drive the agenda and a County committee delivers it. At national level it is the county representatives that drive the agenda and England Golf delivers.

The following is a summary of the principal benefits provided by England Golf (EG) and County organisations.

- **Club Support.** Support affiliated golf clubs with County Support Officers assisting and advising on golf and business related matters.
- **Development.** Assist clubs with development of membership and marketing via the Club Support Officer and County Development Group.
- **Website.** Provide details of services, information and points of contact for EG, SHUGC & SLCGA.
- **Handicaps.** Implement the Worldwide Handicapping System (WHS), and rules of the Council of National Golf Unions (CONGU), and provide advice and guidance on all handicap related matters.
- **Junior Golf.** Provide an environment where young people can take up golf and develop within the sport at the club, county and national level.
- **Safegolf.** Deliver Child Protection and Vulnerable People protection for County events through training certification and a system of welfare officers.
- **Development Structure.** Provide coaching facilities for Junior Boy and Girl Golfers, including sessions for PeeWees and a 'Playing Day' for all Player Pathway Juniors, feeding in to county and national development schemes.
- **County Card.** Provide club members with a facility to play at participating clubs throughout the county and virtually all of England at a discounted green fee, also benefiting clubs through additional green fee, bar and catering incomes.
- **Golf Rules.** Provide advice and guidance on the Rules of Golf and Local Rules, including the training, qualification and development of referees to support competitions.
- **Course Rating.** Undertake ratings for clubs Course Rating and Slope for Men and Women on a rolling basis to ensure that all clubs have a relevant and up to date rating for handicap purposes. Advise on any Course Rating matters.
- **Championships.** Administer Championships for Men, Women, Seniors and Juniors, both scratch and handicap. At the County level, there are 11 Men's and Seniors Championships and 13 for Junior Boys, plus 5 Pee Wee events for the younger junior boys and girls. There are 8 Ladies' and Seniors Championships and 3 Junior Girls' Championships. This is in addition to the many championships organised at the national level.  
Please note that many competitions have a maximum handicap limit for entry, or qualification may be by way of an initial club competition, or by selection at club level.
- **Teams.** Administer Team competitions on an inter-county basis and inter-club basis for scratch and handicap leagues and knock-outs for Men, Women, Seniors and Juniors.  
There are 11 Men's Inter-County matches and 24 Boys Juniors matches of which 8 are inter-county league matches. There are 12 Ladies and Seniors inter-county matches and 12 Junior Girls inter-county matches.  
Please note that team competitions for county events are usually by selection at club level.
