General Conditions applying to all County Junior Tournaments

1. All players must observe the Rules of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and such Local Rules (including Winter Rules) of the host Club as are in force at the time of the competition.
2. All competitors must be of Amateur Status as defined by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews
3. A competitor must be a junior member of an affiliated club in the County Union. A player may only represent that Club which he has declared to be his "Home" club. (i.e. the club which administers the player's handicap)
- 4 The County Junior Committee reserves the right to fix and or alter starting times. Any competitor who is not present on the first tee at his appointed starting time may be disqualified.
5. If adverse weather or other conditions should either curtail or otherwise restrict the completion of a tournament . The Junior Tournament Committee are empowered to vary such Conditions as is necessary to achieve a result.
6. Competitors will not be permitted to ride on motorised buggies
PENALTY for breach of condition: Disqualification
7. No Caddies will be allowed.
8. A competitor shall not knowingly take any drug other than prescribed medication
Any competitor infringing this condition may be disqualified
9. Any competitor whom, in the opinion of the Tournament Committee, during the course of the event, misbehaves by, for example, swearing, throwing clubs, vandalising the golf course or clubhouse, disregards county disciplinary rules or the host clubs rules, may be disqualified and debarred from future County events.
10. Any competitor who having entered an event fails to attend or having qualified withdraws or fails to complete the tournament without the specific permission of a member of the Tournament Committee may be debarred from future county events
11. All disputes shall be settled by the Tournament Committee.
12. any protest must be presented to the Tournament Committee. by the player before the return of the scorecard, or to the Referee before the posting of the match result.
13. A player may obtain distance information by using a device which measures distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a DMD that is designed to measure other conditions that might affect his play (eg. gradient, wind speed, temperature etc) the player is in breach of Rule of Golf 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification. The EGU strongly recommends that Mobile Phones are not used as DMD's and that Rule 16 is observed.
- 14 Additional Rules specific to a competition will be included on the Entry form.
- 15 Players must hand in their scorecard immediately upon completing their round , which must be signed by the player and counter-signed by the marker.
16. Mobile phones must not be used for any purpose other than in an emergency and must be turned off at all times and kept in the player's golf bag.
17. Players should not take trolleys on green surrounds, between green side bunkers & greens and over tees.
18. Players should replace all divots, repair pitch marks & rake bunkers.
